ANTICIPATE YOUR STAY

Visa, Immigration Regulations

Students from outside the European Union may need a visa to study in France.

Make sure to start the visa application well in advance as it may take a long time before you obtain your visa. As immigration regulations are subject to frequent change, we encourage you to contact the French Embassy in your home country and to find out the type of visa you need.

Upon your arrival in France and depending on your nationality and validity of your Visa you will be asked to validate your VLS-TS Long stay Visa

Bank account

We highly encourage you to open a bank account while in France especially for those living in a residence.

Annual fees towards bank account and room insurance: 80€. ICES International Relations Office will assist you with the paperwork.

For residents in the European Economic Area (EEA), Switzerland and Australia, as an alternative, you could apply for a <u>Revolut Card.</u>

Revolut App enables you to transfer money from your home's bank account and change it to Euros onto the card. An easy, simple, quick way to make you saving time and banking fees.

This option does not exclude the fact that you must secure room insurance for the room you are going to rent while in La Rochesur-Yon.

Health Insurance

Non-European citizens must register (for free) to the French Social Security upon their arrival in France. More information on: <u>etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/</u>

Students are exempted from this registration if they hold one of the following documents:

- European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)
- SE401Q102 or SE401Q106 form (R.A.M.Q./Québec)

As the French medical system does not cover 100% of your medical expenses you are highly encouraged to subscribe to a personal travel and medical insurance that will cover the rest of the medical expenses.

Cellphone

You may buy a SIM card from one of the different operators in France (ex. SOSH.fr: unlimited calls from & to Eu-rope for 5€/month). Please ask an ICES student to assist you with getting a SIM Card.

Accommodation

We encourage students to book their accommodation as soon as possible and immediately after receiving their admission letter

Student Card

Once you arrive at ICES you will be given a student card that will give you access to student services: computer rooms, WIFI, library, library-copier, vending machines as well as special fare for transportation, cinema, etc.

Meals

Different options are offered to the students:

Lunch in ICES cafeteria:

by bringing your own meal (on-site microwave oven)

by buying a meal to take away: food-trucks / vending machines (sandwiches, pasta box on site) (5€/10€)

Lunch outside ICES:

Many restaurants, bakeries, fast-food, nearby (7€/20€)

Lunch at the University Restaurant (City Students' Canteen) 26-

minute walk from ICES - 15-minute by bus (bus line 7A or 7B) One meal

UNIVERSITY COURSES

Courses

At ICES, the majority of the professors come from other universities, for this reason the timetables change every week. Timetables are updated every Thursday evening for the following week, so please make sure to check the timetables on a regular basis and at least once a week.

In order to avoid timetable conflict we highly encourage the International Students to choose their classes from the same faculty and/or degree, whenever possible. After your arrival at ICES, you will have a 4-week Add & Drop session before finalizing your learning agreement.

Students are asked to take 30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) for one semester or 60 ECTS for one year. However, we are quite flexible with international students. The number of credits to take must be approved first by your Home University as some countries are using a different credit transfer system.

Credits for the international students are calculated as follows: a 12 hours class is worth 3 ECTS.

Attendance in class

Attendance in class is mandatory.

Non-attendance to classes must be justified by providing a certificate (medical certificate for instance)

Exams

Exam sessions run at the end of each semester.

A detailed calendar is displayed online (timetables) 2 weeks before the exams start.

Thus, it is highly recommended not to book your return tickets before you receive the detailed calendar (or you can book a return ticket with the possibility to change the date without extra fees).

Exams at ICES may be written, oral or on a continuous assessment basis: please check with each professor the way you will be evaluated.
